Antidote Web offers Antidote’s three renowned tools: the corrector, the dictionaries and the guides. The main difference is that these tools will open in a Web browser instead of in Antidote 10’s usual windows.

1. In the vertical panel on the left-hand side, click the corrector icon.
1. Type or copy your text in the central panel. Antidote Web will analyze the text instantly.
1. The list of detections in the panel on the right-hand side provides you with an overview of the corrector's analysis. Click on a detection to find it in the text.
1. The detection prisms are located in the panel on the left-hand side. Antidote shows you the detections for Language first. You can also see the detections for *Typography* and *Style*.
1. When you click on a detection, a tooltip will appear with the relevant explanations. For more information, please see [The Corrector](#) section of Antidote 10's User Guide.
1. Once you have finished correcting your text, click on the toolbar's copy icon at the top of the screen. You can now paste your text in another application.

4 CORRECTING A TEXT FROM ANOTHER BROWSER WINDOW

To correct a text from another browser window, you will first need to install the necessary connector. Antidote Web will give you the option to do so when you log in for the first time.

Install the connector for your browser to be able to access Antidote from whatever web site you are visiting.

Click **Install the connector** and follow the instructions. (Note: There is no connector for iOS or Android.) Once the connector is installed, Antidote's flask will appear in your browser's icon bar. All you need to do is to click the flask to correct the text you have selected in your browser.

5 CORRECTING A TEXT FROM ANOTHER APPLICATION

Antidote Web can also correct a text written in a local application other than your browser. It can be integrated with Word, PowerPoint and Excel. (See [Antidote 10's compatibility](#).)

To run the corrector from such an application, you will need to get the necessary connector with the help of the Connectix tool. It can be installed by following the steps below.

Step 1

In Antidote Web, click on your avatar in the top right-hand corner. Select **Connectors**, and then click **Download Connectix**.

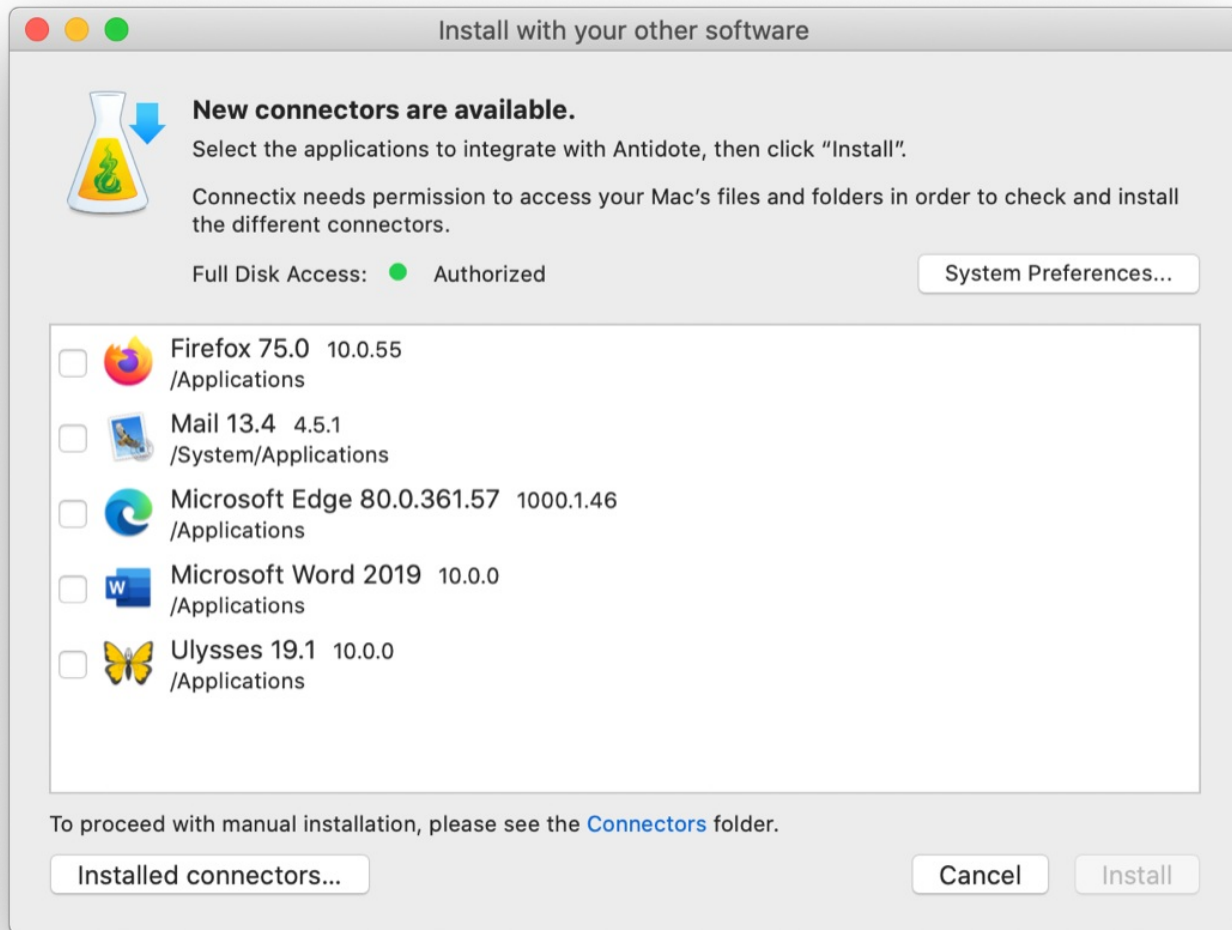
Step 2

Double click on the downloaded folder. It can most likely be found in the **Downloads** folder.

- In Windows, a **Connectix** folder will be created on your desktop. Connectix's installer is located in this folder. All you will need to do is run it.
- On macOS, a disk image with Antidote's flask will be created. Connectix's installer is located in this folder. All you will need to do is run it.

Step 3

Select the applications from which you would like to use Antidote Web.



The way in which Antidote Web is run varies between applications and operating systems. For more information, please see the [Using With Your Other Software](#) section of Antidote 10's User Guide.

Unlike Antidote 10, a local application, Antidote Web does not include the *Anti-Oops!* technology, which is used to automatically check emails before they are sent.
